The Association meets in New Orleans ("The Big Easy"), March 11-13, 2004 at the Le Pavillon Hotel. Mark Partridge, 2004 President-elect is putting together the program with sessions exploring an ever wider range of regional topics. You will note in his call for papers the addition of the topic, Gaming and Gambling, very appropriate to the location. The sessions will begin at 4pm on the 11th and run through 6pm on the 13th. Le Pavillon: A historic first-generation skyscraper, Le Pavillon Hotel, "The Belle of New Orleans," has many unique traditions, such as a nightcap of peanut butter and jelly sandwiches with hot chocolate or cold milk served each evening in the lobby. In downtown New Orleans, a short walk to business and government offices, the Superdome, riverfront, casinos and the French Quarter.

- The winning student is expected to present the paper at a session of the 2004 Meetings of the Association in New Orleans, LA, March 11-13, 2004, using the award to defray costs of attending.

Papers must be double-spaced, no more than 25 pages in length, and written in the style of the Review of Regional Studies. The cover page should include: the paper's title; the author's full name, address, and telephone and FAX numbers; similar information for the sponsor; and an abstract of 100-150 words.
