

Historical Cost of Living Data Available from C2ER

The Council for Community and Economic Research compiles price data on more than 60 goods and services from over 300 urban areas. Published since 1968, the ACCRA Cost of Living Index is the most consistent source of city-to-city comparisons of key consumer costs available anywhere. Usually available in quarterly publications, these data are now available to academics and researchers in one historical dataset representing quarterly data from 1990.

Included are:

- Data analysis for cross sectional, time series, or panel data
- Data available for approximately 300 metropolitan statistical areas
- Data available on a quarterly basis since 1990
- Data organized in six component categories (food, housing, utilities, transportation, health care, and miscellaneous goods and services)
- Data available as quarterly average prices and indexed to a national average
- Available in Excel format
- Participating areas updated based on 2008 metro definitions from the Census Bureau
