

PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- 1. The program is scheduled in **U.S. Eastern Time**. The full and most up to date program is available online at https://easychair.org/smart-program/2021SRSA/
- 2. Papers are typically scheduled for 30 minutes, with 20 minutes for the presentation, five minutes for discussant, and five minutes for quick follow up and additional audience questions. Sessions typically have an additional 15 minutes at the end for further questions and follow up.
- 3. A few sessions have only three papers but are scheduled for two hours and 15 minutes. These should still devote 30 minutes per paper as indicated in the program and use the final 45 minutes for additional discussion or adjourn early.
- 4. A few sessions have five papers or no discussants. The session chair should communicate specific time expectations to session participants in advance.
- 5. Presenters, discussants, and session chairs should remain for their entire session.
- 6. Please adhere to the program times since some in the audience may want to attend a particular paper in one session and then others in a different session. In the case of a no-show, please use the open time to discuss previous papers. Do not shift papers around.
- 7. Zoom virtual rooms will be available approximately 5-10 minutes before the start of each session. Session participants should arrive at least five minutes early and use the "raise your hand" feature for the room host to make them a panelist and allow them to share their screen.


